
Overlapped Boats Starboard Rounding



Several overlapped boats tacking at a weather mark left to Starboard

At position 1, Red, Green and Brown are tacking to roung the mark. Yellow and Blue are on starboard tack and approximately 4 boat lengths astern of Red.

At position 2, Red and Green are now on port tack heading to the next mark. Brown has just passed head to wind while tacking to port. Yellow and Blue have caught a good wind puff that allowed the starboard tack boats to close the gap with Red, Green and Brown.

In this situation, Red has tacked and is clear enough from Yellow and is now the ROW boat over Green, Rule 11. Green has also completed her tack to port but must keep clear of Red, Rule 11. Brown has slowed while tacking and is in danger of failing to keep clear of Yellow and or Blue while tacking, Rule 13 and 10. When Brown tacks back to starboard to stay clear ahead of yellow and or Blue, Yellow and or Blue will probably have enough room to tack around the mark while keeping clear of Green. Blue must be careful that she can tack inside of Green and keep clear of Green while she tacks, Rule 13. Brown will likely be the last boat to round the mark.
