On Sunday Jack faltered early and Chris had a string of 3 bullets that allowed him to momentarily tie Jack. Then, Jack regained his Saturday form while Chris ran into early start-itis. Meanwhile, Tony got back in swing with a series of 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place finishes. While Jack bested the field by 16 points after three throw outs. Tony managed to nudge out Chris for 2<sup>nd</sup> by 3 points. Chris actually finished ahead of Tony prior to the throw outs demonstrating that if you are going to have a bad race, make it really bad.
